

RESIDENCE HALL MOVE IN TO-DO LIST

Before you arrive on Campus:

- Sign your housing contract online through the Campus Living Portal on CheckMarq
- Order your schoolbooks and have them delivered to your home address or order the books and pick them up at the Marquette bookstore on campus.
- Rent a microwave-refrigerator through housing (it will be delivered to your room before you arrive)
- Pack
 - Medications (Send new medication orders to Walgreens at 16th and Wisconsin Ave)
 - Electronics (computer, phone, TV, chargers)
 - School supplies
 - Cleaning supplies for your bathroom
 - Clothes (daily wear, winter coat, shoes, boots etc)
 - Toiletries
 - Bedding for an XL twin bed
 - Snacks
 - If you order anything online, it is recommended that you send your items to the closest store location to Marquette University for you to pick-up on move-in day



RESIDENCE HALL MOVE IN TO-DO LIST

During Move -in Day

- If using a vehicle, pull up to the front of your assigned residence hall
- Check-in at the front of your building
- Sign your key card
- Check-out a cart at the front desk to help move-in your belongings
- Move-in your belongings into your room
- Unpack and get settled in your room
- Attend orientation events
- Pick-up your Marquette ID at the AMU
- Attend your first-floor meeting with the resident assistant of your floor



RESIDENCE HALL MOVE IN TO-DO LIST

Before your family leaves make sure you have your:

- Textbooks
- School supplies (notebooks, pen, pencils, binders, binder dividers, folders, highlighters etc)
- Your electronics (computer, phone, TV, chargers)
- Cleaning supplies for your bathroom (if you have your own bathroom)
- Marquette ID
- Bank Account Information
- Attend orientation events
- Paperwork to be hired if you are applying for an on-campus job (passport or State/Drivers license ID and birth certificate)
- Important phone numbers: Emily, Grad Coach, Peer Mentor

WHAT TO EXPECT

At Your 1:1 Meetings with your Resident Assistant (RA)

- RA will get to know you (You can share as much or as little as you want);
You may wish to talk about your ASD
- You will get to know your RA
- You will talk about getting involved on campus, social justice-
Marquette values, and reflect on the year as a whole
- Ask some (5 at most) remaining questions from the floor
